Why the Protestant Church rejects the Apocrypha as Scripture

- 1. It was not accepted accepted by the Jews as the Word of God and early Church fathers such as Josephus.
- Jesus and the Apostles did not accept the Apocrypha
- The New Covenant of Grace does not validate or teach us to accept the Apocrypha
- The Apocrypha itself does not claim to be inspired and its content sometimes contradicts teachings of both Old and New Testaments.

The Apocrypha / Deuterocanonical books teach many things that are not true and are not historically accurate.

While many Catholics accepted the Apocrypha / Deuterocanonicals previously, the Roman Catholic Church officially added the Apocrypha / Deuterocanonicals to their Bible at the Council of Trent in the mid 1500s A.D., primarily in response to the Protestant Reformation.

The Apocrypha / Deuterocanonicals support some of the things that the Roman Catholic Church believes and practices which are not in agreement with the Bible. Examples are praying for the dead, petitioning “saints” in Heaven for their prayers, worshiping angels, and “alms giving” atoning for sins.

Some of what the Apocrypha /
Deuterocanonicals say is true and correct.
However, due to the historical and theological
errors, the books must be viewed as fallible
historical and religious documents, not as the
inspired, authoritative Word of God.
