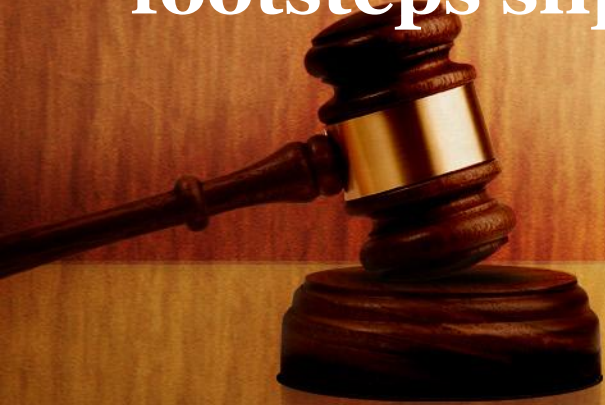
**II. David's presents
