<sup>3</sup> Who shall ascend into the hill of the LORD? or who shall stand in his holy place?

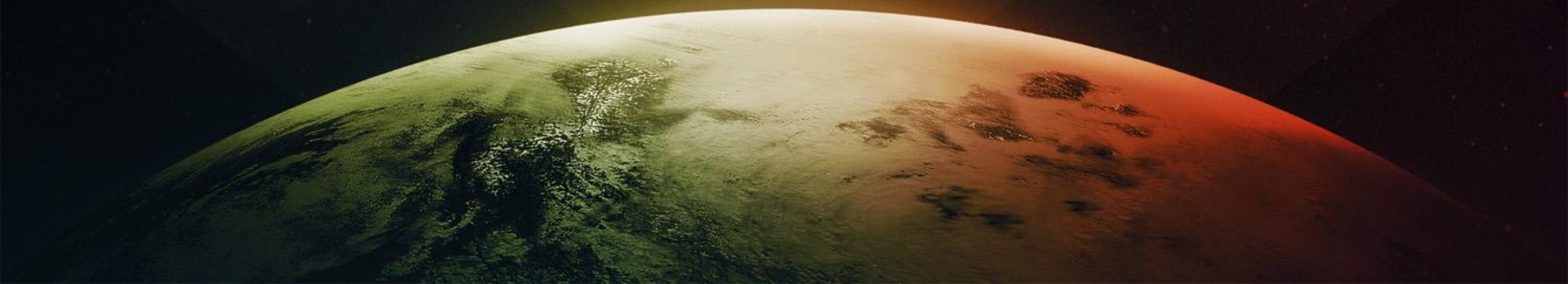
<sup>4</sup> He that hath clean hands, and a pure heart; who hath not lifted up his soul unto vanity, nor sworn deceitfully.

glory shall come in.

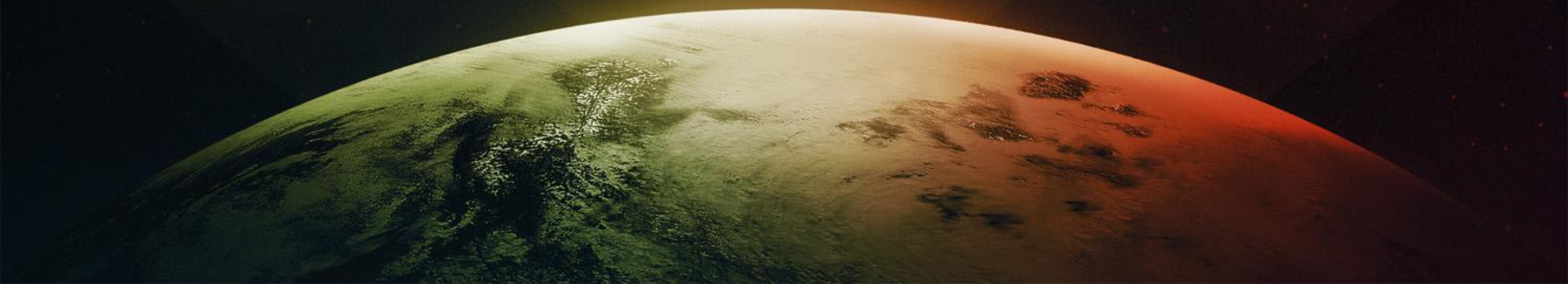


<sup>8</sup> Who is this King of glory?

the LORD mighty in battle.

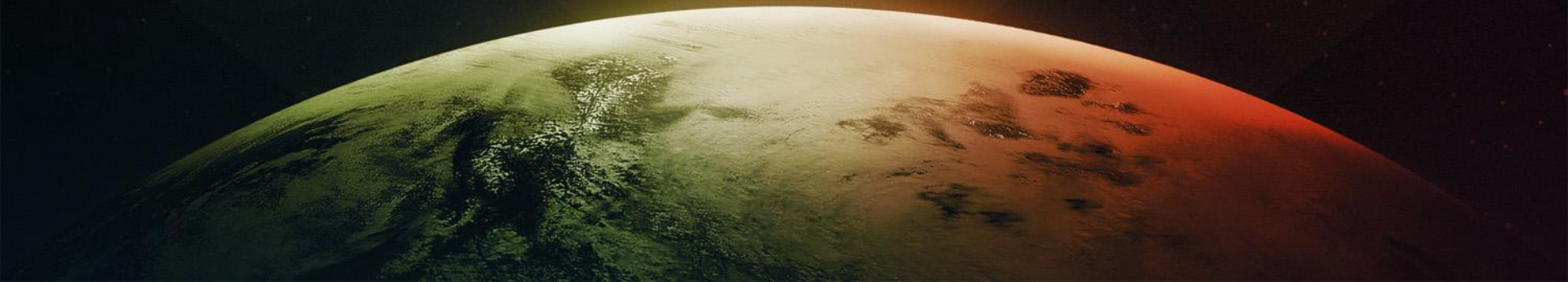
<sup>9</sup> Lift up your heads, O ye gates; even lift

King of glory shall come in.

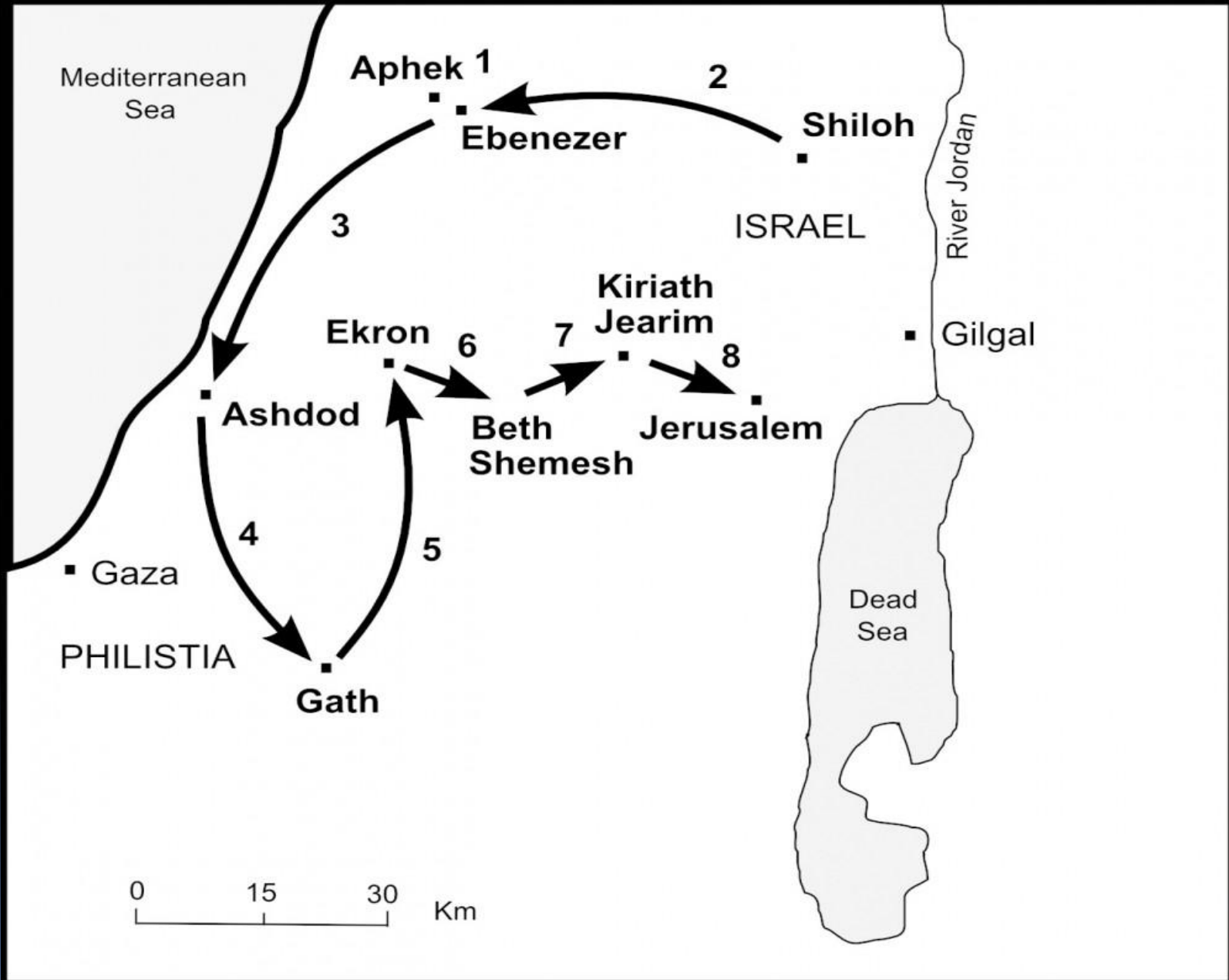
<sup>10</sup> Who is this King of glory? The LORD of  
hosts, he is the King of glory. Selah.


